

## Frequently asked questions

The day is 9-3 and transport drop off and collect students at the rear of the Lodge.

There is no uniform requirement, but we do ask that clothing is worn that is appropriate to the environment and is okay to get dirty, we would appreciate a pair of wellies and a rain coat on site at all times.

Lunch is between 12 and 1 and is delivered by a local school, prepared fresh daily. Payment is made to the school office or via Tucasi as at school. Students will prepare packed lunches at the Farm for the days that they go out.

The course the students are on is called OCR Life and Living skills, this is the course title for your son / daughter's benefit forms.

A weekly payment towards off site activities, including use of the Gym and attending Zumba, football skills etc can be made weekly monthly or termly. £3 a week

Students have a tutor base but are taught by all the teachers at the Farm;

All tutors will give you a mobile number and email that will be available during office hours. 9-5.

EHCP reviews will be held on site at the Farm, these will be carried out as Person centred reviews and will include the opportunity to plan additional meetings for any issues arising as each meeting is scheduled for 1 hour.

There will be a residential opportunity in the Spring term, one night for each student, all staffing for this is done on a voluntary basis.
