
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
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D16 have enjoyed making nachos this week. This involved planning what we wanted on them and then adding our chosen toppings.

Since our last newsletter the development of the workshop has continued we are very excited with our new tools including a bandsaw and a pillar drill, these will be commissioned shortly and we are already planning projects we can achieve with them.

Students have been working on projects for the college community and for themselves to take home over this term.


Bee Hotels – made from bamboo and pallets – very popular with customers and bees.
